# SAC Principal Report - February 01 Meeting

## **December: Christmas Spirit Week**

Our students Enjoyed:

- PTO and Ash Lee Jefferson bought ornaments for each family. We knew that we couldn't sell for profit and we didn't want the tradition to be interrupted. We also wanted to do something special for our community.

## Professional Development Week: January 4-8:

- Started with a message from Deputy minister
- Administration and teachers were responsible for handing in a detailed plan for learning for the week.
- The Program team developed a comprehensive schedule for online support and synchronous professional development during the week of January 4 to 8 for all staff. Sessions focused on tools and techniques for supporting blended and/or remote learning
- All learning centered on: Black Lives Matter in Education, Student Well Being and Social Emotional Learning, Inclusive Education Policy, Technology for on line learning.
- As we worked on the key areas we always focused on the following questions:

## Meeting Notes:

- 1. Christmas Spirit Music Presentations, "Jingles and Mrs. Claus" visited. Santa was there for bus duty.
- 2. Professional Development Week
  - Successful sessions, positive week with staff feeling empowered, reviewed planning/Equitable Learning/Black Lives Matter/Changes required due to Covid 19. Also putting together an Equity Team.
  - support staff also received PD.
- 3. Outdoor Classroom
  - PTO purchased pea stone to replace muddy, slippery mulch and replaced by generous volunteers on a Friday evening.
- 4. Martin Luther King Day/African Heritage Month will tweet pictures of Art produced.
- 5. February is Registration Month for Pre-Primary and Primary
  - Encourage any families with children this age to register, registration is done online.
- 6. February 9<sup>th</sup> will be Lockdown Drill.
- 7. Valentine's Day
  - Valentine's cards will not be permitted to be handed out this year because of COVID restrictions, instead the school will have a Kindness week and encourage students to pay a compliment to a friend/staff/family member. Some teachers have set up online Valentine's for their students to send which required a great deal of pre-planning and time but will be well received by students.
- 8. Grade 5's visit from GPV and band teacher
  - visit to prepare Grade 5 students for Junior High and visit from Band teacher to discuss types of instruments they can select. Visit was a success.
- 9. PTO bought this year's Christmas Ornament (snowman with mask) for each family.

# **COVID 19 Protocol Changes**

- Returned to allowing running shoes to go home and back in case schools close again to avoid issues experienced during last shut down.
- Singing is now permitted in school provided students wear masks and are 6 feet apart.

## **Other Business**

- Concerns brought forward regarding traffic on Lockview Drive, the speed of cars and the short distance between the 30km School Zone sign and the actual school. Suggested that all members contact both 311 and the councillor to voice concerns to see if distance between school and signs can be lengthened. Lynn and Jennifer to also inform school Liaison officer and will also contact 311.
- Wellness Survey Completed by students in Grades 4-8 and results indicated 96% and 94% completed. 6-10 students indicated that they do not always feel that they belong. The follow-up question indicated that a few students misunderstood the question, however steps are being taken to discuss social and emotional well-being with teachers and come up with a plan to address those students who require help. The survey questions will be sent out again in April to re-examine.
- Live link now online for school clothing. School colours are the primary blue/red/yellow as in logo. This allows Grade 5's to order the graduation sweatshirts as is tradition. Any funds received by school from this company will be put into technology. Any students who are brought to their attention that want school clothing, but cannot afford, support will be given to them so as not to have them left out.
